STAYMAN, TRANSFERS, CHECKBACK STAYMAN AND PUPPET STAYMAN

STAYMAN

Stayman recognises the importance of a 4-4 major suit fit, <u>only use Stayman</u> when you can cope with any response your partner could make

Use Stayman over:

- 1) 1NT opening bids
- 2) 1NT overcalls
- 3) 2NT opening bids
- 4) 2♠ opening bids if followed by a 2NT rebid (showing 23/24HCP)

Consider using Puppet Stayman over opening bids (or rebids, as in 4 above) where the hand can contain a 5 card major

EXAMPLES OF STAYMAN

If you have 8HCP (over a strong 1NT opener) or 11HCP (over a weak 1NT opener) - if partner denies a major by bidding 2♦ you can bid 2NT (invitational to game)

Use Stayman even with a weak hand if you have 5 of one major and 4 of the other:

♦J10765 **♥**K642 **♦**Q **♦**852

Bid 2♠* - if partner bids 2♥ or 2♠ you have a fit so pass - if partner bids 2♦ you can bid 2♠

You can bid Stayman if you have a very weak hand and are short in Φ 's - with this hand bid 2Φ * and then pass whatever partners response is:

♦ J 8 6 3 **♥** 107 4 **♦** Q J 8 7 5 **♦** 10

You may find a 4-4 ♠ fit or a 4-3 ♥ fit or a 5-2 ♦ fit at worse - all will probably play better than 1NT

PUPPET STAYMAN (5 card stayman)

This is mainly used over a 2NT opening bid or over an opening 2♣ if followed by a 2NT rebid (showing 23/24HCP) both of which may contain a 5 card major :

Bid 3♠* asking for either 5 or 4 card majors - if partner has a 5 card major he bids it (3♥ or 3♠)

If partner bids 3NT over your 3♠* enquiry he has neither a 5 or 4 card major

If partner bids 3♦ over your 3♠* enquiry he has at least one 4 card major

Over openers 3♦ response to your 3♠* enquiry; <u>3NT denies a 4 card major</u>; with one major responder <u>bids the suit he has not got</u> - i.e. 3♥ shows ♠'s and 3♠ shows ♥'s; if responder has both 4 card majors he bids 4♦ to let opener choose the final contract

All this ensures the strong hand will always be declarer

TRANSFERS

Transfer bids are used over 1NT opening bids, 1NT overcalls, 2NT opening bids an 2♠ opening bids if followed by a 2NT rebid (showing 23/24HCP); the same as when Stayman is used

Reasons for using transfer bids:

- 1) Usually the opening hand is the stronger and transfers keep it concealed
- 2) A trick is often gained from the opening lead going round to the stronger hand
- 3) It gives more options when trying to judge the final contract

You should <u>always transfer if you hold a 5 card major</u>; you should only transfer to a minor (via 2NT) if you are considering a slam or have a weak unbalanced hand with a 6+ card minor

STAYMAN, TRANSFERS, CHECKBACK STAYMAN AND PUPPET STAYMAN

Over 1NT:

- 2♦ Shows at least 5♥'s asks partner to bid 3♥
- 2♥ Shows at least 5♠'s asks partner to bid 2♠
- 2♠ Shows 8/9HCP (strong NT system) or 11/12HCP (weak NT system)
- 2NT Transfer to a minor asks partner to bid 3♠ which will either be passed or converted to 3♦

Transfers give you plenty of options if you hold a 5 card major and have 8/9 (strong NT system) or 11/12HCP (weak NT system) :

1NT - 2♥* - 2♠ - 2NT (responders rebid shows 8/9 strong NT system or 11/12 weak NT system)

- 1) Opener with a minimum and only 2♠'s should pass
- 2) Opener with a maximum and only 2♠'s should bid 3NT
- 3) Opener with a minimum and 3+ ♠'s should bid 3♠
- 4) Opener with a maximum and 4+ ♠'s should bid 4♠

1NT - 2♥* - 2♠ - 3♠ responders rebid shows 6♠'s and 8/9 (strong NT system) or 11/12 weak NT system)

- 5) Opener with a minimum and only 2♠'s (or with 3♠'s and a very poor minimum) should pass 3♠
- 6) Opener with a maximum and 2+ ♠'s should bid 4♠

Over strong 2NT openings & 2NT rebids after a 2₱ opening showing 23/24HCP:

- 3♦ Shows at least 5♥'s asks partner to bid 3♥
- 3♥ Shows at least 5♠'s asks partner to bid 3♠
- **3**♠ Shows **5**♠'s **AND 4♥**'s

Super Accepts

This is used if partner transfers over your 1NT opening bid and you hold 4/5 of the suit they are transferring you to

- 1) 1NT 2♦* 2NT shows 4/5 ♥'s and a maximum opening HCP range
- 2) Responder must repeat the transfer by bidding 3♦ and can either pass 3♥ or bid 4♥
- 3) 1NT 2♦* 3♥ shows 4/5 ♥'s and a minimum opening HCP range

With a 9 card fit in the suit you can afford to play at the 3 level even if partner was going to pass over the transfer

CHECK BACK STAYMAN

Check back is generally used after a 1NT rebid; it is useful if you are trying to find a 5-3 or a 4-4 fit in a major suit (for example $1 \lor - 1 \spadesuit - 1$ NT): it can also be used over a 2NT rebid (e.g. $1 \lor - 1 \spadesuit - 2$ NT)

Again just like normal stayman you must have a response for any of the replies partner may give and by using check back you must be interested in a fit in one of the majors

- 1 ♦ 1 - 2 (is check back) looking for either a 4-4 ♥ fit or a 5-3 fit
- 1) 2♦ response denies 4 ♥ 's or 3♠'s
- 2) 2♥ shows 4♥'s and does not deny 3♠'s
- 3) 2♠ shows 3♠'s and denies 4♥'s
 - 1♥ 1♠ 2♠* (<u>is check back</u>) looking for a 5-3 ♠ fit
- 4) Only responses are 2♦ denying 3♠'s or 2♠ showing 3 card ♠ support
