**Financial State of JSOB**, as reported at the annual meeting: Through September 30th, the club netted \$30,000. \$11,000 of that amount came from donations and \$5000 from the July Sectional. So, we are clearing about \$1200 per month from play. We need more play. We are assessing our building needs for the next few years and have several expenses coming: gutter replacement, cracks in stucco, more plumbing, painting, lawn replacement or resod, roof replacement, etc. **Please consider playing at the club once a week if you are not doing so now.**
