Mentoring Program

After a year hiatus due to Covid-19, the JSOB Mentoring Program is back in full swing this year with face-to-face bridge. This free program provides an opportunity for newer and developing players to increase their skills in all facets of the game by working and playing with more experienced players in an open section environment. The program runs on a calendar year, and mentees play with their mentor at JSOB once a month. We also culminate and celebrate the year with our annual Mentee/Mentor game in late fall. We have 21 Mentees in the program this year, running the gamut from 1st year mentees with few masterpoints to 3rd year mentees with several hundred. We will be gearing up for 2023 shortly, and if this is something that might interest you, I invite you to read the Mentee Guidelines that describe the program in more detail and include the requirements and prerequisites for participation. This can be found on our club website under Education/Mentoring. Signups will be held during the month of November, and we will also offer a general informational meeting prior to that, to talk about the program and answer any questions you might have.
