2/1 GAME FORCE WORKSHOP QUESTIONNAIRE August 23, 2025

Bridge Players who have taken a 2/1 Game Force class or are learning on their own have expressed that it is difficult to practice because there aren't that many opportunities that come up during a usual Duplicate Game. This is our inaugural event to address this request.

A variety of Deals have been pre-dealt that provide opportunities to practice 2/1 Game Force bidding. They come from a variety of 2/1 GF texts. One of the issues is that there isn't a current ACBL Standard 2/1 Game Force Bidding System similar to the Standard American Yellow Card (SAYC). The first round of bidding is agreed. If neither hand is a passed hand, then a Responder response to a 1-level Opener followed by no interference is Game Forcing if the response is a 2-level bid of a lower-ranking suit. A response of 1NT is a 1-round Forcing bid (Announcement Alert) because the range is that of a minimum or medium Responder hand (6-12 points or less than Game-Going hand).

However, what the bids mean for the following rounds vary based upon the guru/expert/teacher sharing that knowledge. You and your partner need to discuss and agree what you want to use in your approach. Following are some questions you should review to agree upon then come and practice bidding these hands to fine tune your bidding language.

1 NT Forcing (over 1S/1H; max 12 pts):
Does rebid by Opener of Major = 6+? (Y?)
Does Opener bid reverses and jump shifts? (Y?)
Does Opener bid longer minor if no 4-card suit? (Y?)
Is rebid by Responder of his minor forcing? (2=N?)
Is jump shift by Responder weak rather than 1NT?
How bid w/4-card support? Bergen/Reverse Bergen?
How bid w/3-card support?
How bid w/2-card support?
Choose to use Semi-Forcing 1NT? Definition?
With 3-card support & 6-9 pts, 1H-2H?
With 3-card support & 10-12 pts, 1H-1NT,2C-3H or 2H-4H
since know Opener has 6 H?
How Responder show balanced, 2-card supt, 10-12 pts?
Inverted Minors?
New Minor Forcing?
Constructive raise?
Help suit game tries?
