This is an EBU competition with handicaps based on players' NGS ratings. To win a pair needs to exceed their predicted score by the highest percentage giving all participants an equal chance of winning.

The event is taking place in various clubs across the country and Somerset are hosting a virtual session. The expectation is that the format will constitute 30 or so boards played in a single session so finishing mid afternoon. Seeing a few Somerset names on the leaderboard would be great.

PAIRS LEAGUE on REALBRIDGE

THE PAIRS LEAGUE RETURNS!

This popular event will return in the Autumn but in a different format. Leagues will be formed from those entering and the competition will be a Swiss Pairs event with IMPS scoring played on Realbridge. There will be 5 sessions in the first iteration of the league and each session will consist of 2 x 12 board matches.

Sessions will start at 7.15pm usually on the last Friday of the month. The first match of each series is a random assignment. The movement for all remaining matches in sessions 1, 2 and 3 is then Swiss. The Swiss is then reset before Session 4 so you may play again pairs in session 4 and 5 that you have already played in the first 3 Sessions.

The size of the divisions and the criteria for promotion and relegation will depend on the number of entries. Substitute players and pairs may be used by agreement with the organiser and only if the NGS grades of the replacement player/s are within one grade of the player/s to be replaced.

At the end of season 1 promotion and relegation will take place before the second season starts in the Spring.



A fun one from the European Championships France playing Ireland.

With Ireland North-South the bidding proceeded thus, South opening 1NT.

2C stayman, 2D denying, 3NT by North making plus one for 430 and a flat hand predicted.


Not quite.

Pilon for France opened 1NT but Bompis raised to 3 clubs which was alerted.

Hanlon opted to double for the lead and Pilon redoubled. Passed out this also made plus one but for a score of 840.

A rather Gauling 9 imps.

A few hands later and this happened to redress the balance:



The bidding was the same in both rooms this time 1NT by West, 2C, 2D, 3NT.

Nothing to see here.

A spade lead won in dummy was the first trick in both rooms but at this point the play diverged somewhat.

McGann led a small diamond from the table! The defence never found their fit and Ireland made plus one while France went three off in the other room.

I wonder what the French for 'hornswoggle' is?

Note: Translated as 'corsaire' according to Google.... maybe the Irish flag should be changed to the skull and cross-bones.

To end as we began – The West of England Congress is only a month or so away.
