
SOMERSET CONTRACT BRIDGE ASSOCIATION

From the Chair

Now that we are all returned from our summer activities, we are getting back to our autumn and winter bridge.

Our clubs are reporting improving attendance and there seem to be more people wanting to play. This was borne out by the numbers who played at the West of England Congress at Weston-super-Mare in October. With the improvement in attendance, we were able to deliver a healthy profit for our county funds.

Events

The 9-High event, held at Woolavington in July, was a great success with many comments received as to how enjoyable the event was. Several pairs played in this as their first county event and found it not as daunting as they had feared.

As your chairman, I attend the EBU county Chairs' meetings, where we share ideas, successes and failures. One thing I took from the last meeting was that several counties are running 7-High events with great success. Historically, players ranked NGS 7 and below have rarely played county events due to a fear of embarrassing themselves – well, 7-High is the answer: an event designed for the more novice player to experience a competition especially for them. Your committee is working to find dates for these, going forward, and the first event is planned for 10th December, so please enter and dip your toes in the water, and also sample the wonderful teas provided. So that the more experienced players do not feel left out we are looking to run a J-High event soon.

A new initiative from the EBU is the Festival of Bridge in the autumn of 2024. It is intended that there will be some national events but all clubs are being encouraged to run a special event under the Festival of Bridge banner. The SCBA would like all clubs to appoint a liaison person to be the point of contact so we can share ideas and give assistance. A further reminder for your diaries: Andrew Robson's next seminar for our members will be held in Street on 13th March 2024.
