
#### Overview

The Vanderbilt Bridge Club of Nashville has contracted with BridgeWebs to host our internet website effective January 1, 2013. This site is specifically for bridge clubs and it offers some additional features and capabilities beyond what we are able to do on our current site. Some of these additional features include:

- Automatic results calculation from ACBLSCORE game file
- Improved results viewer
- Simplified website maintenance
- Competitions can be created on a custom basis to promote interest
- Personal Analysis players can view their historical results by partner, best percent, masterpoints, etc.
- Members Only Section the website has the ability to limit information to members only. We are not currently utilizing this capability no credentials are required to review results, etc.

#### Results

The most common reason to visit the website is for players to view their results. They will use their favorite internet browser and will go to <a href="http://www.bridgewebs.com/vanderbilt/">http://www.bridgewebs.com/vanderbilt/</a>. This will bring up the homepage.





There are several ways to locate the bridge results for the game you are interested in seeing. If you want to see the most recent game that would have been posted, simply click the Latest Result button.




If the game you are interested in is one of the last 3 played, you will see it listed here.

If you are interested in locating another game result you may click the Results button here and it will bring up the most recent games played at the club.


To access a current copy of the club directory, click here.





To view the results of a particular game you simply click it to display the results.

If you are looking for a result from a different month, you can click the Calendar Month button and it will display the following screen: From here you can click on a particular month and then select the event.





Once you have determined which results you want to view and have clicked on the particular event you will see the ranking screen. If the event was a pairs game the screen will be similar to this:




This screen shows the overall results of the first section (in this case Section A) of this event. If you played in this section and want to review your particular results, find your name on the list and click it to display your personal scorecard.

If there were multiple sections in this event, you will see the other sections displayed as buttons along the top of the screen. Simply click the section you want to review.

For this example, we shall review the results of Linda Hanson and Coley McGinnis. To do that, we simply click on their names.



In this example we are looking at the personal scorecard for Linda Hanson and Coley McGinnis who sat E/W at table 4 in Section A as indicated here:



You can see the Bid, By, Lead, Tricks, + / - Score and Matchpoints for all 27 boards in this area. The matchpoints are color coded with shades of green indicating good boards and shades of orange and red indicating bad boards. At the bottom of this area you can see the percentage (68.8%) and the total score (148.5).

On the right side of the screen you can see the details of a particular board, here we see board 1. In the top area you see the hand, complete with High Card Points, double dummy analysis and optimum result.

In the bottom right you see the traveler information for this board with Linda and Coley's result highlighted.

If you let your mouse hover over a pair number on the traveler, it will display the names. I was curious who made 6NT and hovered over E/W pair A8. You can see it displayed Phillip Vest and Nancy Evins.

In the upper right, you see grey buttons which allow you to navigate through the various boards. If you all of your boards in order, you can simply click on the next board button.

In this case, it looks like Linda and Coley had a bad board on board 9. We can go directly to that board by clicking the 9 button.





Now as we view the hand record for board 9 you can see why they got a bad board. Again, you will see on the traveler that Linda and Coley's result is highlighted. You should also notice that the traveler is sorted according to highest N/S score. If you were sitting E/W, the further down the traveler your pair number appears, the better your score.

Now we shall explore the other buttons found at the top of the scorecards page. In this case they are Matrix, Travelers, Hands, Section A, and Section B. Had there been additional information for this event, such as hand analysis from a charity game, an information button would be visible and you would click it to view the additional information.




#### **Matrix Screen**

#### Hand Record Screen



This is an example of the hand record screen. From this screen you have the ability to generate your own custom hand records with either 3X4 or 4X5 hand records on a page and in PDF or HTML format.



You also have the ability from this page to transmit the Portable Bridge Notation (PBN) file of the event to your PC so you can replay the hands using your own bridge playing software. You enter your email address and click send.

If the event was a team game, such as a Swiss Team or 8 is ENUF, a screen similar to the following will be displayed:





# Results – Team Game (cont.)

To view the details of the matches, click the Information button, If there is no information button, please notify the director.



When you click the Information button you should see a screen similar to the following: Please note this is a standard ACBL report and if you want to view the entire report, you need to use the scroll bars on the side to move through the report or click this link to open it in a separate window.





This page gives you access to news about BridgeWebs. It also contains a link to the iPhone App.







# Miscellaneous
